Speakers and Presenters

Dr Giulio Calcara: is a Lecturer in Law at the University of Plymouth, whose research mainly focuses on transnational criminal law, human rights, international police cooperation, INTERPOL, and policing outer space. Dr Calcara's publications on INTERPOL are highly influential and have been cited and quoted in numerous academic works, as well as international and governmental reports. One of his publications was quoted by the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit in *El Omari v. International Criminal Police Organization* (2022).

Ben Keith: is a leading barrister specialising in cross-border and international cases. He deals with all aspects of Extradition, Human Rights, Mutual Legal Assistance, Interpol, Financial crime and International Law including sanctions.
